

## Treaty Land Entitlement Initiative

## Land Selection and Eligibility Confirmation Process October, 2003 Update

## Status

Further to the terms of the July 30, 1908 Adhesion to Treaty No. 5, the May 29, 1997 Treaty Land Entitlement Framework Agreement and the July 30, 1998 NCN Treaty Entitlement Agreement (TEA), a total of 79, 435 acres are outstanding to the NCN as Treaty Entitlement Lands. Once eligibility has been confirmed, these acres will be set apart as additional NCN reserve lands.

To date, NCN has made 40 selections for a total of 70,460.88 acres. At present, the NCN Treaty Land Entitlement Initiative is working to confirm the eligibility of each of these 40 selections. A detailed table setting out the status of these sites is attached. A summary of the status is:

- ✓ 12 selections have been confirmed as eligible to be set apart as reserve lands and 7 of these eligible selections are being surveyed and set apart as reserve lands.
- 13 selections (33% of the total) are eligible subject to the determination of a Hydro easement. The methodology to be applied to the determination of Hydro easements for these 13 eligible selections remains under discussion between NCN and Manitoba Hydro.
- ✓ 5 selections require resolution of mining interests. Manitoba has confirmed that mining interests on NCN selections will not be renewed when they expire.
- ✓ 4 selections require resolution of provincial interests in aggregate deposits (gravel).

  NCN has requested that Manitoba refine and confirm interests in gravel.

Further to a 1995 NCN Band Council Resolution, **17,674.29 acres** of the total NCN TLE acres are to be selected by NCN **on behalf of the O-Pipon-Na-Piwin Cree Nation** (South Indian Lake). On July 28, 2003, NCN made 48 Crown land selections for a total of 35,700 acres on behalf of the NCN membershp at the O-Pipon-Na-Piwin Cree Nation. The O-Pipon-Na-Piwin Cree Nation is now prioritizing these selections.
